Final Comments & Questions

Using a variety of sources, both English and Czech, the author has produced a well researched thesis on a complex topic. Space considerations probably precluded a more detailed analysis of the questionnaire data, otherwise there are some aspects which might have been worthy of further comment. For instance, intuitively, one might suppose that the more elderly of the two response groups would have demonstrated a greater proclivity towards belief in the traditional gender stereotypes - and, indeed, this is borne out particularly in statements 3, 4 and 11, plus the men's response to statement 8. On the other hand, the figures for statement 8 are something of an anomaly: any expectations of the elder group adhering to erstwhile traditional beliefs of serious public speaking being a primarily male domain are not only thwarted but comprehensively dismissed by a difference of -39% in the male and -42% in the female responses respectively when compared to the corresponding younger age group. The author does not offer any tentative explanation so, assuming it is not just a quirk of the data collection, this is a topic which could be discussed at the defence
