Final Comments & Questions

The above assessed undergraduate thesis deals with a very complex, but on the other side very interesting topic, which represents a subject matter often discussed and considered in practical use of the English language. It is the way of expressing negation with a special focus on the use of determiner of nouns in negative sentences. The expression of negation represents one of the most important functions of language.

In the Introduction the author provides the general status of the negation and introduces the topic itself. The following theoretical part provides a perfect base for the following process of analyzing individual cases of the occurrence of negative sentences with a noun determined by individual determiners (no, a, any, zero).

The analysis, as we can see in the appendix, is detailed and particular, taking into account the type of the noun, the type of the phrase in which it appears, its syntactic function as well as its Czech equivalent.

In the chapter Analysis the author deals with the results obtained from the actual analysis and thus provides a starting point for drawing relevant conclusions in the final chapter of her work. The conclusions to which she came which only underlined her profound knowledge of the subject matter.

The language of the work and the formal lay-out are outstanding. The spelling, grammar and punctuation are standard.

In my opinion, this work is an excellent piece of academic writing.
