In my opinion, the author did a great job with creating the questionnaire. I appreciate that she designed all the sentences for the exercises herself and also programmed the electronic version of the questionnaire. However, I believe that descriptions related to Delphi6 on pp. 16-17 were too detailed and some facts could have been omitted because they did not directly relate to the topic of the thesis.

To sum it up, I would like to congratulate the student on producing an excellent piece of work and recommend the following evaluation: "excellent".
